

Persistent organic pollutants (POPs)

Persistent organic pollutants (POP) are organic substances that persist in the environment, accumulate in living organisms, and pose a threat to our health and the environment. They can be transported across international borders by air, water, or migratory species, and they can reach regions where they have never been produced or used. POPs are regulated worldwide by the Stockholm Convention and the Aarhus Protocol. This legislation is implemented in the European Union by the POPs Regulation. The POP Regulation aims to protect human health and the environment with specific control measures.
